#### Welcome from the Board President

35 Years.

A lifetime of music.

Decades of singing - of connection - of community and friendship. Years of uplifting art – and uplifting each other. So many years that we now have the children of the original Berkshire Children's Chorus in our midst as singers themselves.

When I first found the Berkshire Children's Chorus community, I was looking for an artistic opportunity for my daughter and never imagined I would also find an artistic home and community for myself. I walked my daughter in to meet Artistic Director, Ryan LaBoy, in a quiet church in Sheffield, and three years later here we are...at Tanglewood. It has been quite the ride.

Three years ago, this intrepid group had triumphantly made its way through the pandemic and had a mighty nine singers showing up every week to be together and join in song. We were still meeting (AND REHEARSING!) in masks – and taking everyone's temperatures at each rehearsal to make sure we were caring for our community as best we knew how. The drive to be in person and connect after the hardship of COVID was strong and, with Ryan at the helm, that little group not only connected – but thrived through the strength of community and music.

Since then, we have grown, and grown, and grown again! Our mighty 9 has turned into a robust 40 – in three locations! We first tipped our toes into the Pittsfield Community with our pilot program "Play and Sing" – and suddenly had 14 more singers! This year we have added a third location in North Adams – and those new members are joining us here at Tanglewood today – for their first show with Berkshire Children's Chorus.

I have spent my life in the arts – much of it focused on how to create artistic opportunities for children. I can say without hesitation that the experience being created at Berkshire Children's Chorus is unparalleled – from the sense of belonging and community in the room, to the purpose and drive felt as the singers find their artistic voices and share them in our community, to the incredible choral music being shared in beautiful performance spaces throughout Berkshire County. This artistry radiates out into the families and community we are surrounded by- we are so much more than the sum of our parts. The chorus is leaning into what it means to create an artistic home for the children and families of Berkshire County.

We have so much ahead of us as an organization – so many wonderful and exciting plans. We would love to have you as a part of our extended family – either as a singer, a volunteer, a donor – or even a board member!

J.M. Barrie famously wrote "If you cannot teach me to fly, teach me to sing." Come fly with us – for the next 35 years.

#### Welcome from the Artistic Director

#### A REFLECTION FROM NANCY LODER, FOUNDER OF BERKSHIRE CHILDREN'S CHORUS

"As I began my work in the SBRSD, I had a great desire to create a Children's Chorus in our local community—to really and truly make a community chorus where singers from my school district and neighboring districts could come together and sing. Hence, the beginning of the Berkshire Children's Chorus. The Chorus started in Sheffield and then grew into Great Barrington. As we grew, we were able to eventually take trips to other nearby places—even performing at Carnegie Hall!— and to begin our travels abroad to Italy, Germany, France, and England. We were also lucky to work with some really fine children's choral composers, like Henry Leck and John Rutter. In the long run, I was the lucky one who dreamed it up, but I had massive support to make those dreams come true!" – Nancy Loder

### THE CHORUS TODAY: BUILDING ON A LEGACY OF COMMUNITY AND MUSIC

Today's performance, WE ARE THE MUSIC MAKERS, celebrates Berkshire Children's Chorus's decades-long legacy of dreaming, building, and singing with our children at the center. We are thrilled to make our debut solo performance at The Linde Center as part of the Tanglewood Learning Institute's Close to Home Mini Festival. For this occasion, we would like to share some new music with you: The Dream Keeper, Here Comes the Sun, Spark and Breath, and We Are the Music Makers—each selected as a vibrant expression of our present growth!

This success, beautifully captured in Jennie Jadow's letter, is built on a foundation established over the past 35 years. In addition to having Nancy Loder with us today—whose biography (p. 12) and reflection above exemplify her warmth and commitment to building community through music and singing—we are thrilled to welcome back a special chorus of alumni. It is exciting and meaningful to celebrate their enduring legacy as we simultaneously welcome singers from our new North Adams rehearsal location. Today, the past and future collide, creating a kaleidoscopic view of the Chorus and serving as a heartfelt testimony to the belief that we all are the music makers!

During our performance, we will also honor one of the Chorus's greatest champions, Alice Maggio, whose longtime connection to BCC serves as a bridge from the past to the future. From singing with her sisters in the Chorus as a child to eventually serving as Board President, Secretary, and Member at Large—Alice has led with wit and grace, exemplifying the very best of Berkshire Children's Chorus. In gratitude for her, Nancy, our alumni, and our storied past, we sing songs "from the vault," including: *O Music, This Shall Be for Music, Yo Le Canto Todo El Día, The Storm is Passing Over*, and *Al Shlosha D'varim*—each selected as a precious reminder of our musical heritage.

In West African culture, there is an *adinkra*, or symbol, called *Sankofa*, which means "to retrieve." One version of the adinkra depicts a bird looking back over its shoulder, sometimes grabbing an egg with its beak. It is often associated with the proverb, "It is not wrong to go back for that which you have forgotten," and this message is apropos to our performance today. *WE ARE THE MUSIC MAKERS* represents not only our flying into the future, but also our commitment to carrying the stories and songs that have brought Berkshire Children's Chorus this far. We are so thankful for all the singers, conductors, pianists, guest musicians, parents, friends, families, and audience members we've had over the years, and we cannot wait to see what the future holds.

#### **About Berkshire Children's Chorus**

Celebrating its 35th anniversary season, **Berkshire Children's Chorus** uses music to spark new friendships between singers in grades 3-8 from across the Berkshire region. Weekly rehearsals, offered in both Sheffield and Pittsfield (and recently piloted in North Adams!), feature the development of individual self-confidence and teamwork skills, as well as music reading, ear training, and vocal technique. The Chorus was founded in 1990 by **Nancy Loder** and is currently led by **Ryan José LaBoy**. Recent performance highlights include *Lessons & Carols* at Williams College, *Fauré's Requiem* with Trinity Lenox Music Series, *The Sounds of Music* with Berkshire Concert Choir, *Cántame un Cuento* with Berkshire Immigrant Center and LitNet, *Circles* with Pittsfield-based visual artist Elizabeth Nelson, *The Ballerina and the Clown* with singers and dancers from Bard College at Simon's Rock, and a co-commission, "O Colored Earth" by Steve Heitzeg, with Stockbridge Sinfonia. The Chorus also has a multi-year partnership with Sheffield-based ukulele manufacturers, The Magic Fluke.

## Additional Info about Today's Performance Artist Bios

#### Nancy Loder | BCC Founder and Founding Artistic Director

One of Nancy Loder's earliest musical memories involves collecting neighborhood kids in junior high to form a makeshift "band" for Fourth of July parades, much to the delight of parents on the block! This early passion for engaging children with music led to her work as a music teacher in the Southern Berkshire Regional School District. Beyond her initial project creating a folk dance day, she established and directed numerous choruses across elementary, middle, and high school levels, including select ensembles like Baker's Dozen, Countdown, Madrigal Singers, Retro, and Dial Tones. Annual musicals such as South Pacific became a staple. To truly extend their work into the community, Nancy founded the Berkshire Children's Chorus in 1990, uniting young singers from various schools in a shared love of music.

#### Ryan José LaBoy | Artistic Director

Ryan José LaBoy is a singer, conductor, and community musician based in Pittsfield, MA where he serves as Artistic Director of Berkshire Children's Chorus and Berkshire Concert Choir. Previously, he served as Choir Director at Bard College at Simon's Rock (Great Barrington, MA), Director of Choirs & Voice at North Hennepin Community College (Brooklyn Park, MN), and Founding Music Director of ComMUSICation (St. Paul, MN)—an El Sistema-inspired music program focused on social justice and youth empowerment. As a singer, Ryan has performed with The Sound Between Ensemble (New York), Unitus Ensemble (Boston), Border CrosSing (St. Paul), MPLS (imPulse) (Minneapolis), VocalEssence Ensemble Singers (Minneapolis), and Ember Choral Arts (New York).

Ryan holds degrees in Choral Conducting and Music Education from the University of Minnesota and Westminster Choir College, and is currently a doctoral student at Teachers College, Columbia University. His research is located at the intersection of community arts and public health, including practices of community music, the advent of social prescribing in Massachusetts and the United States, and the transformative power of singing together.

#### Aaron Likness | Rehearsal & Performance Pianist

Aaron Likness is a pianist based in upstate New York, hailed for "superb clarity" and "effortless elegance" in performances of a wide variety of classical, avant-garde, and contemporary music. Recent seasons have included appearances across the US and Europe with Boston Musica Viva, Callithumpian Consort, International Contemporary Ensemble, Sound Icon, PROTOTYPE Opera Festival, and violinist Diamanda Dramm. A graduate of the New England Conservatory of Music and the University of North Carolina, Likness serves on the music faculty of Bard College at Simon's Rock.

#### Charles Tsui | Rehearsal Pianist, North Adams

Charles Tsui is an accomplished collaborative pianist based in the Berkshires where he is an Artist Associate in Collaborative Piano at Williams College. Formerly Assistant Professor at Missouri Valley College, he held the Dr. Phillip Sisk Memorial Piano Chair with Topeka Symphony Orchestra and was the collaborative pianist for Youth Chorus Kansas City. He has performed internationally in China, England, Hong Kong, Japan, South Korea, Taiwan, and across the U.S. Charles holds a Doctor of Musical Arts from the University of Missouri–Kansas City.


Berkshire Interfaith Organizing exists to connect our communities across lines of difference, so that we can identify common concerns, develop leadership through action, and win positive changes in our county.
